1. Purpose. To outline holiday periods to be observed during calendar year 2014 (CY14).

2. Background. This Bulletin is published in conformance with the references. Each holiday period has been modified in accordance with paragraph 3 of reference (a).

3. Action

a. In accordance with reference (a), liberty will not exceed the limitations as set forth in the table below. Pay particular attention to the established liberty limits, per reference (c).

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b. Leaders will ensure their Marines' privately-owned vehicles are inspected for safety and all out-of-bounds requests are routed through the chain of command at least five days prior to the commencement of the respective holiday period.

c. All hands are reminded that the judicious and effective use of annual leave is a good risk mitigation tool for those desiring to travel outside established liberty boundaries or who desire to extend their stay over specific holidays.

d. Liberal leave policy will be in effect for civilian employees during these periods. Supervisors are encouraged to approve annual leave requests for civilian personnel in other-than-essential positions.

e. Safety, to include anti-terrorism/force protection (AT/FP), of all personnel is paramount. Leaders will ensure that all hands are briefed about safety and AT/FP precautions before travel and recreation begins.

4. Reserve Applicability. This Bulletin does not apply to the Marine Corps Reserve.
