## MOTORCYCLE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

The following PPE is mandatory for all personnel operating or riding as a passenger on a motorcycle aboard MCLB Albany

Head Protection	Eye & Foot Protection	Clothing Civilian Attire	Clothing Marines in Uniform
 <p><b>HELMET:</b> A properly fastened (under the chin) protective helmet, which meets the standards of Snell Memorial Foundation (SNELL), or the Department of Transportation (DOT).</p> 	 <p>Impact or shatter resistant goggles or full-face shield attached to the helmet. A windshield, eyeglasses, or fairing alone is not considered proper eye protection.</p>  <p>Hard-soled shoes with heels.</p>  <p>The use of leather boots or over the ankle shoes is encouraged.</p>	<p>Properly worn Long-sleeved shirt (sleeves rolled down) or jacket, long legged trousers and full-fingered gloves or mittens.</p>  <p>Full-fingered gloves</p>  <p>Motorcycle riding jackets and pants constructed of abrasion resistant materials such as Leather, Kevlar, and/or Cordura and containing impact-absorbing padding are strongly encouraged.</p>	<p>Properly worn Long-sleeved shirt (sleeves rolled down) or jacket, long legged trousers and full-fingered gloves or mittens.</p> <p>Civilian attire, such as long-sleeved T-Shirts or Jackets may not be worn over the uniform.</p> <p>Marines are authorized to wear a Motorcycle-Riding Jacket constructed of abrasion resistant materials such as Leather, Kevlar, and/or Cordura and containing impact-absorbing padding over the uniform while on the motorcycle.</p> <p>The jacket must be removed as soon as the Marine dismounts the motorcycle.</p> <p>The Jacket must not contain graphics or text considered inappropriate with the image of the Marine Corps.</p>
