





# CY20 Command Safety Program Goal



## GOAL: Reduce Slip, Trip & Fall Injuries by 50%

**Background:** According to OSHA, slips, trips and falls account for 15% of fatalities and 25% of injuries each year. In this command, 29% (43 of 149) of our total injuries (first-aid and OSHA-recordable) in the last five years were caused by slip, trip or fall hazards. Additionally, 38% (71 of 187) of near misses reported in the command in the last five years were slip, trip or fall hazards.

**References:** 29 CFR 1910.21, *Subpart D – Walking Working Surfaces*

**Goal:** Reduce slip, trip and fall injuries by 50% (no more than 4 injuries) compared to the last five year average (8 injuries).

**Target Date:** 18 December 2020

**Goal Leader:** Division Directors, Special Staff, HQ Company Commander

**Goal Progress Reporting:** Directors, Special Staff and HQ Company Commander will brief the progress of this goal at the Commanding Officer’s Quarterly Safety Council.



## **As of 31 March 2020**




# CY13-CY20 Military WESS Reportable Cases MCLB Albany


# CY13-CY20 Civilian Lost Day Cases MCLB Albany



as of 31 Mar 20










**Green Flag (WBGTI of 80 to 84.9 degrees F):** Heavy exercises, for non acclimated personnel, will be conducted with caution and under constant supervision.



**Yellow Flag (WBGTI of 85 to 87.9 degrees F):** Strenuous exercises or physical labor will be curtailed for non acclimated, newly assigned Marines and Civilian Marines in their first 3 weeks. Avoid outdoor classes or work in the sun.



**Red Flag (WBGTI of 88 to 89.9 degrees F):** All PT or very strenuous work will be curtailed for those not thoroughly acclimated by at least 3 weeks. Personnel not thoroughly acclimated may carry on limited activity not to exceed 6 hours per day.




**Black Flag (WBGTI of 90 and above degrees F):** All nonessential physical activity will be halted.

MCLB Albany Prescribed Burning  
Natural Resources will begin conducting prescribed burns across the installation beginning in February and running through July. Approximately 1,200 acres will be burned on MCLB Albany over the course of the next six months with the bulk of burning taking place between February and April. During this time expect to see fire activity and smoke, particularly during dry, sunny conditions. Motorists should slow down when driving through controlled burn areas, especially if heavy smoke is present. Natural Resources conducts burning under weather conditions that minimize the impacts to those who work and live aboard the installation, however, residual smoke is unavoidable. Please note that MCLB Albany's neighbors also conduct prescribed burns and generate smoke which may be present aboard the installation. Individuals with breathing conditions such as asthma should avoid exposure to smoke. Prescribed burning is an integral part of managing southern pine forests and maintaining healthy ecosystems. Without periodic controlled burning, forest health and wildlife habitat are negatively impacted and the accumulation of forestry debris could contribute to damaging wildfires.

# Heat Illness Prevention Program



## To help prevent heat related illness:

- Stay hydrated properly with water and diluted electrolyte. Drink water every 15 minutes, even if you are not thirsty.
- Make sure you are acclimated to your environment.
- Rest in the shade to cool down.
- Wear a hat and light-colored clothing if you are working outside.
- If you have a pre-existing health problem, ask your doctors advice before jumping into outdoor activities.
- Learn the signs of heat illness and what to do in an emergency.
- Keep an eye on fellow workers.
