CY21 Command Safety Program Goal



GOAL: UPDATE EAPs

Background: Supervisors are required to have an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) for each office and/or shop for which they are responsible. Supervisors are also required to train their employees and contractors on the EAP, conduct an annual evacuation drill for all personnel and assess the effectiveness of their EAP. As of 31 Dec 20 only 42 of 62 (68%) work areas occupied by command employees and contractors were compliant with having a current EAP, documented EAP training, and conducting and assessing an annual evacuation drill.

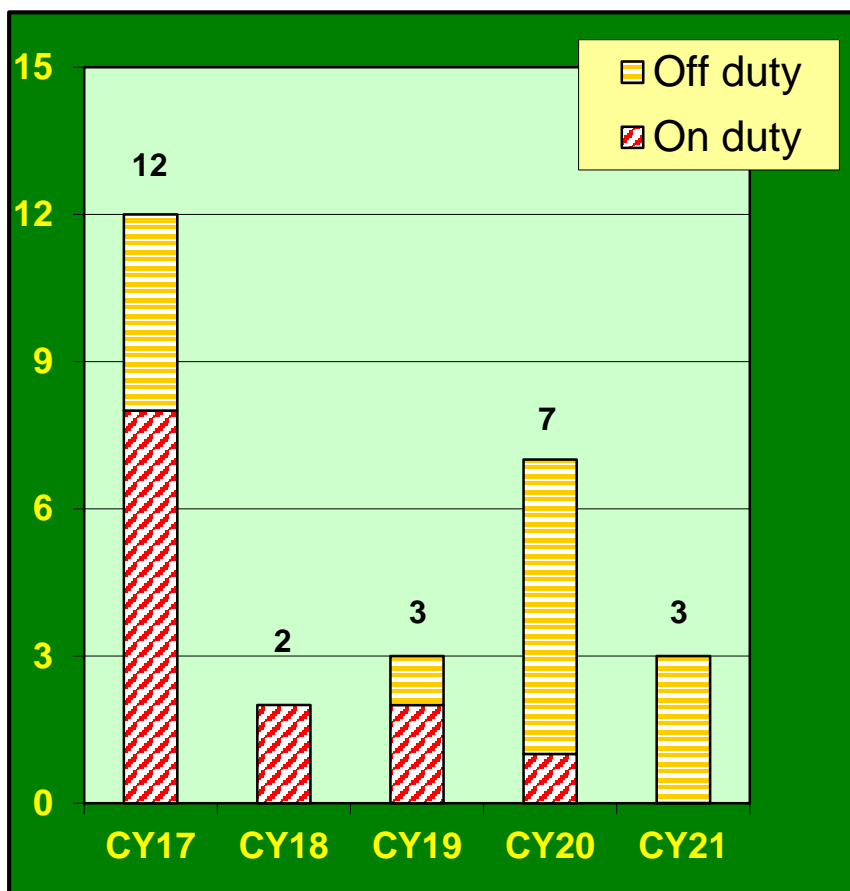

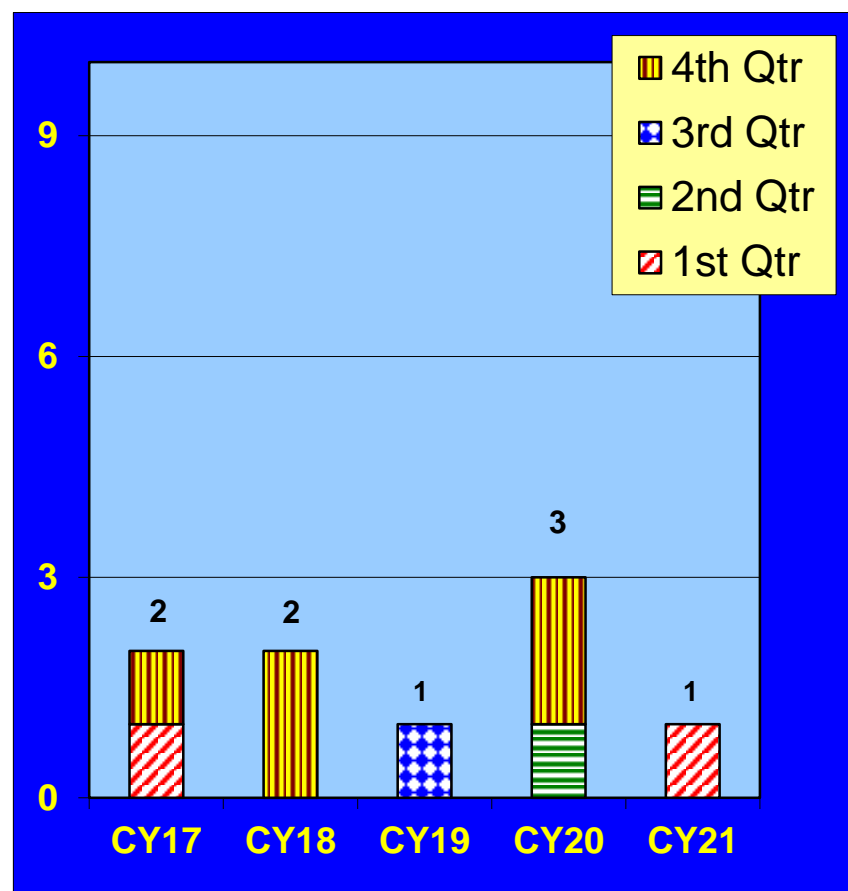

CY17-CY21 Military RMI-SIR Cases



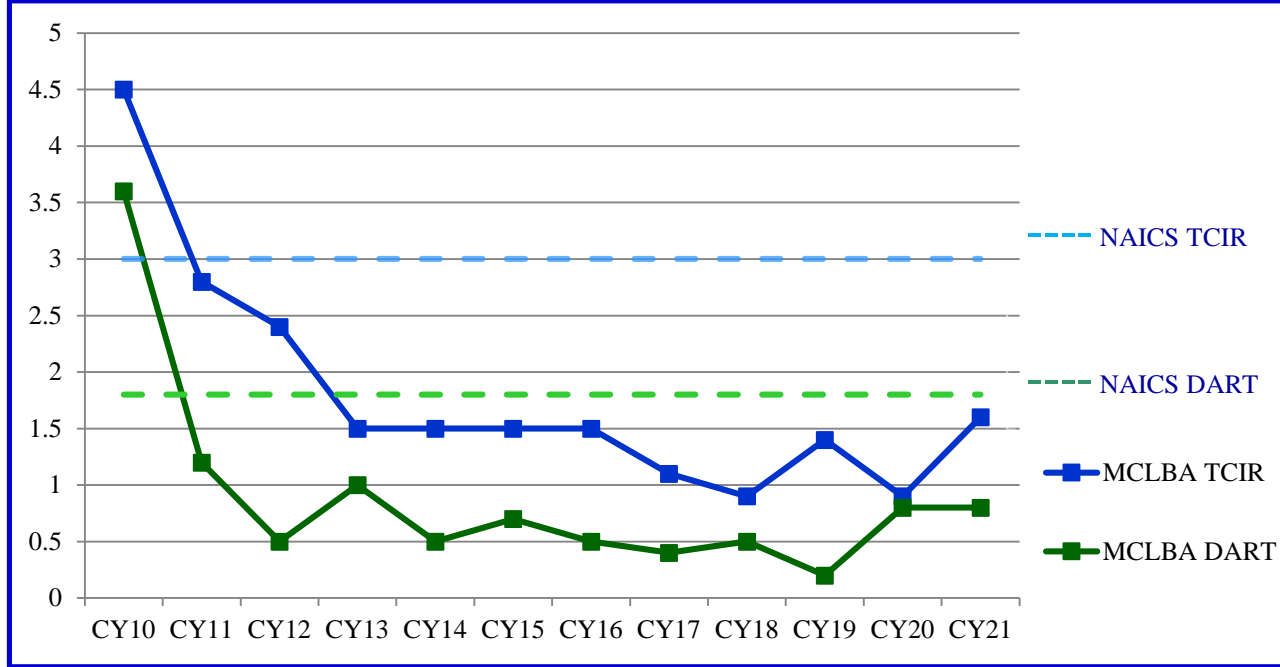
CY17-CY21 Civilian Lost Day Cases

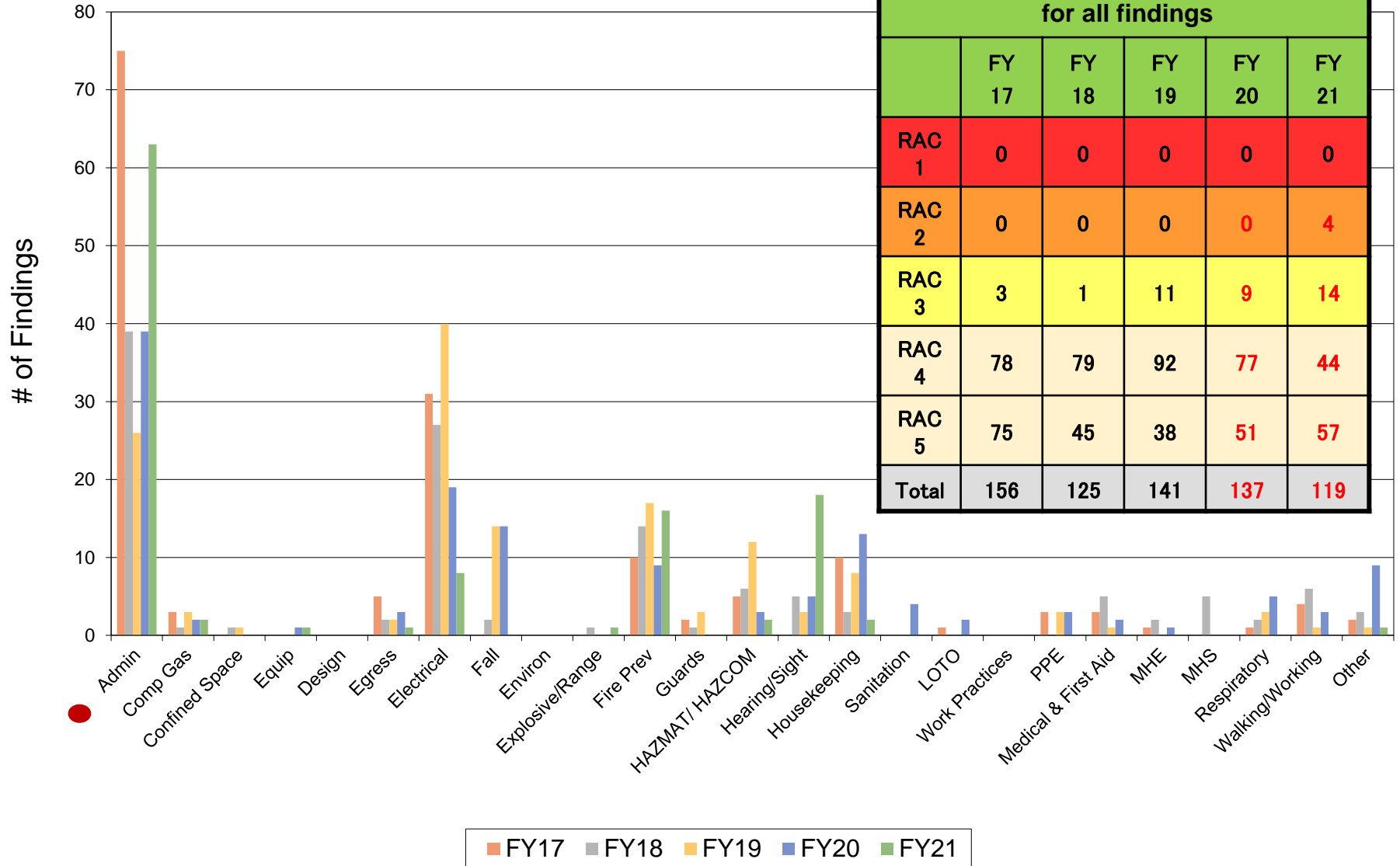

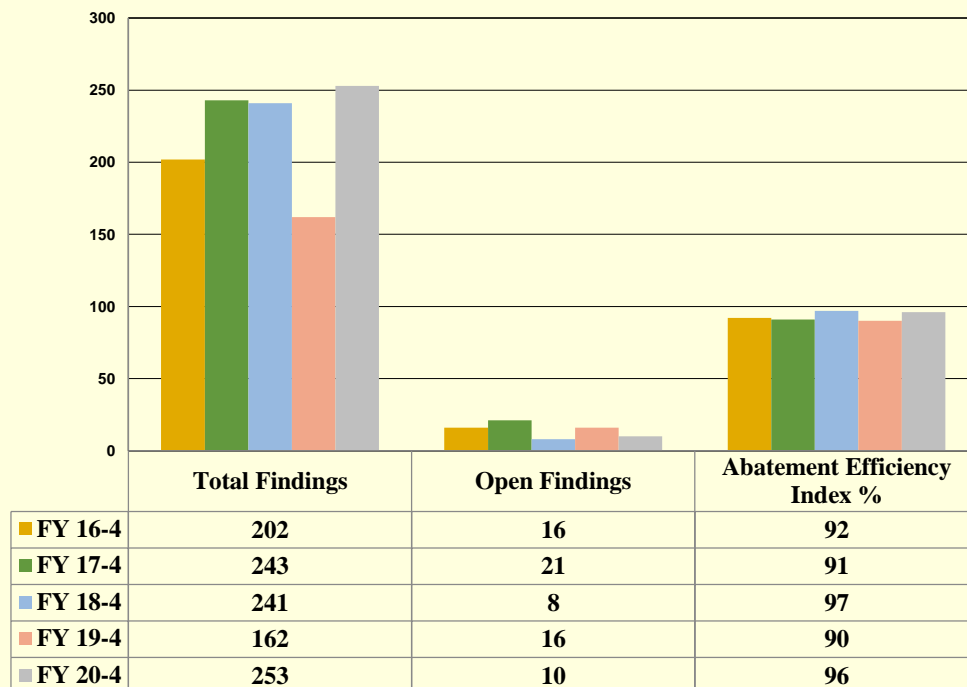

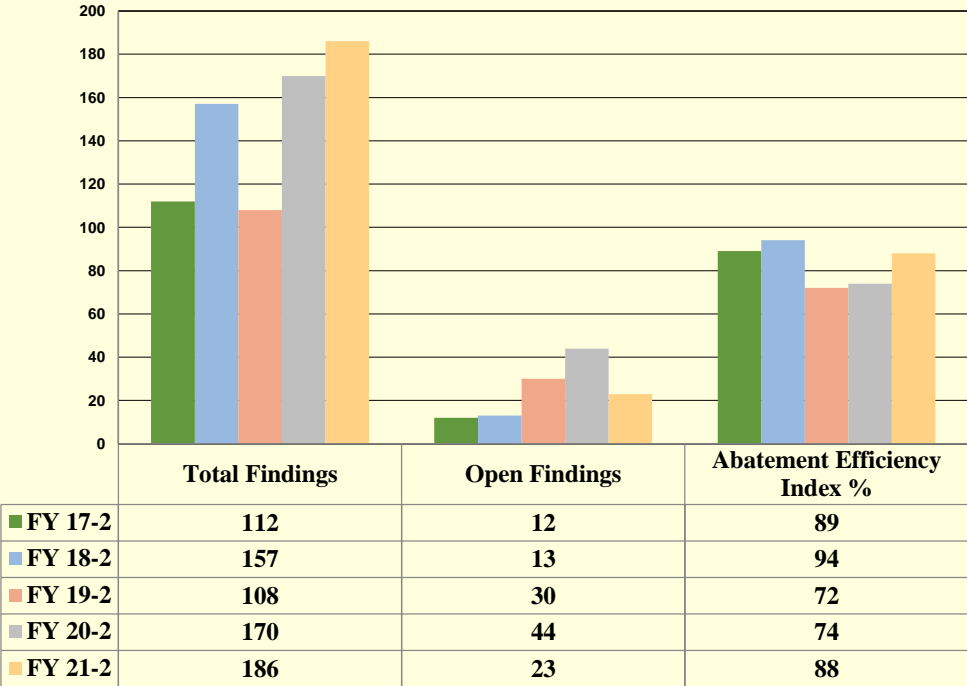

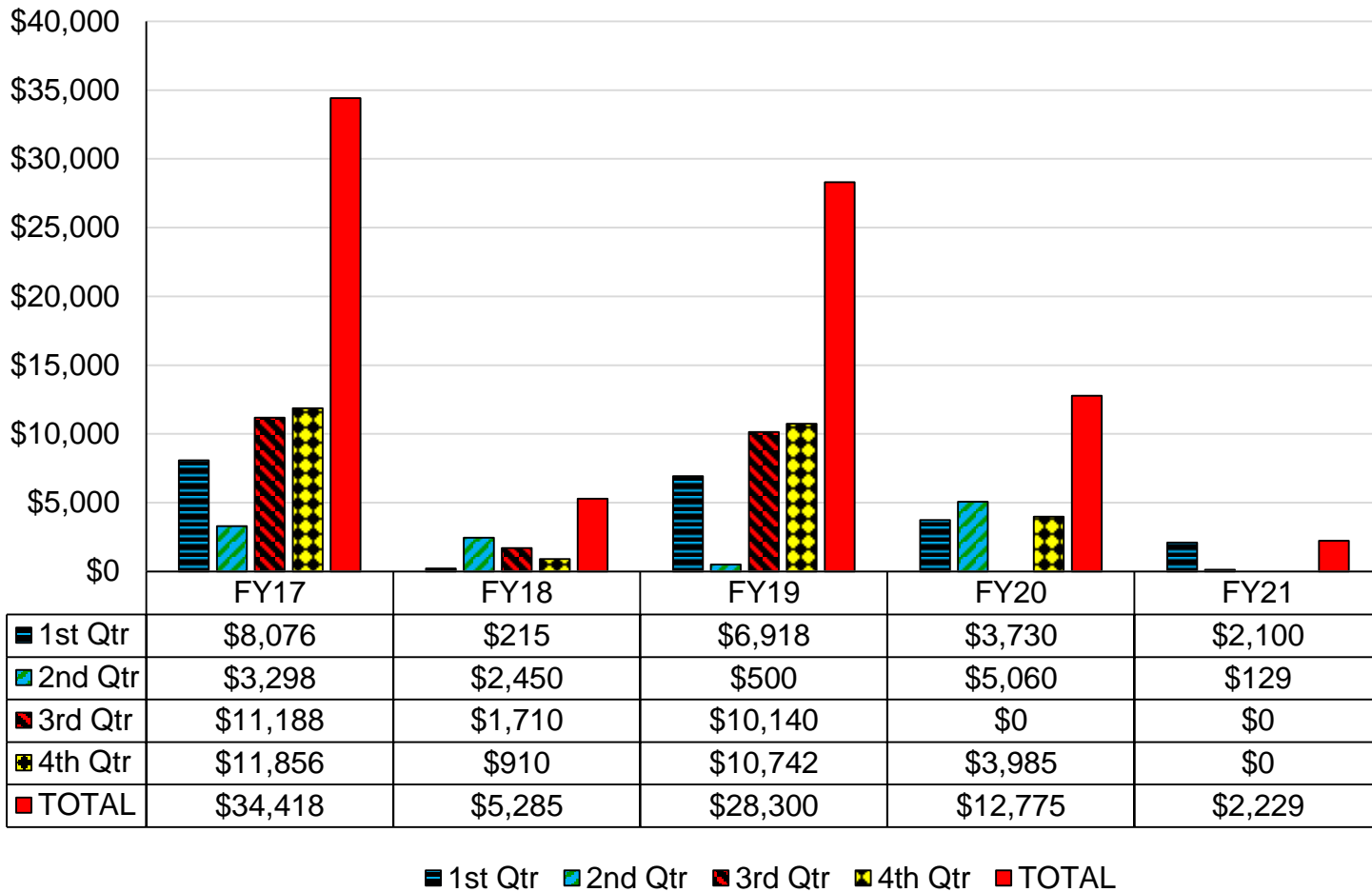
Successes, Initiatives, and Concerns

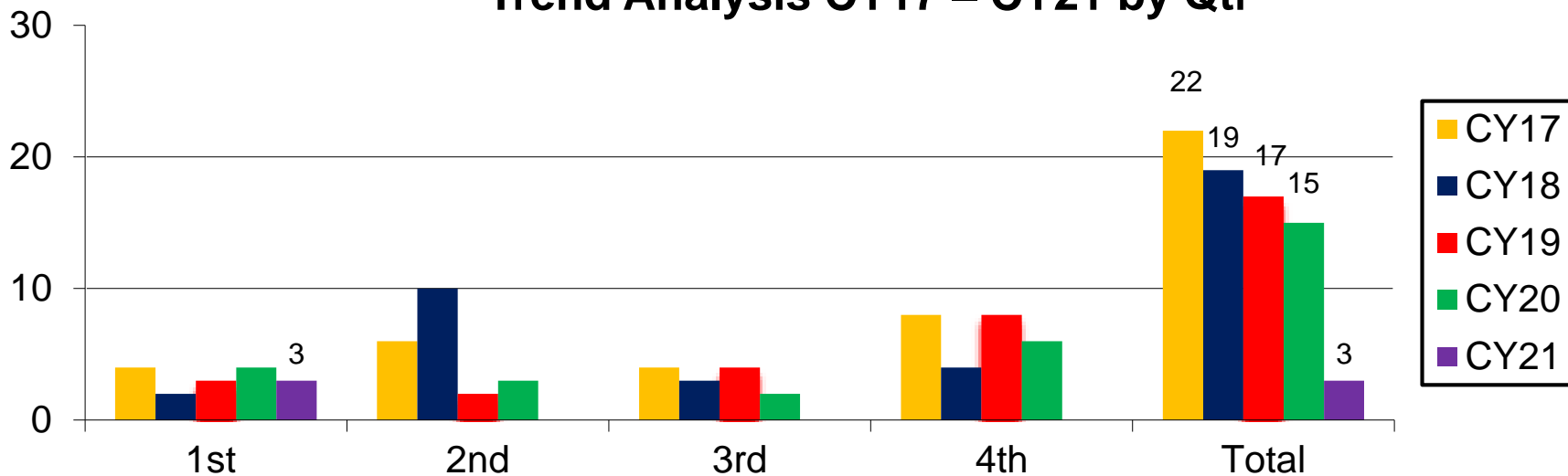

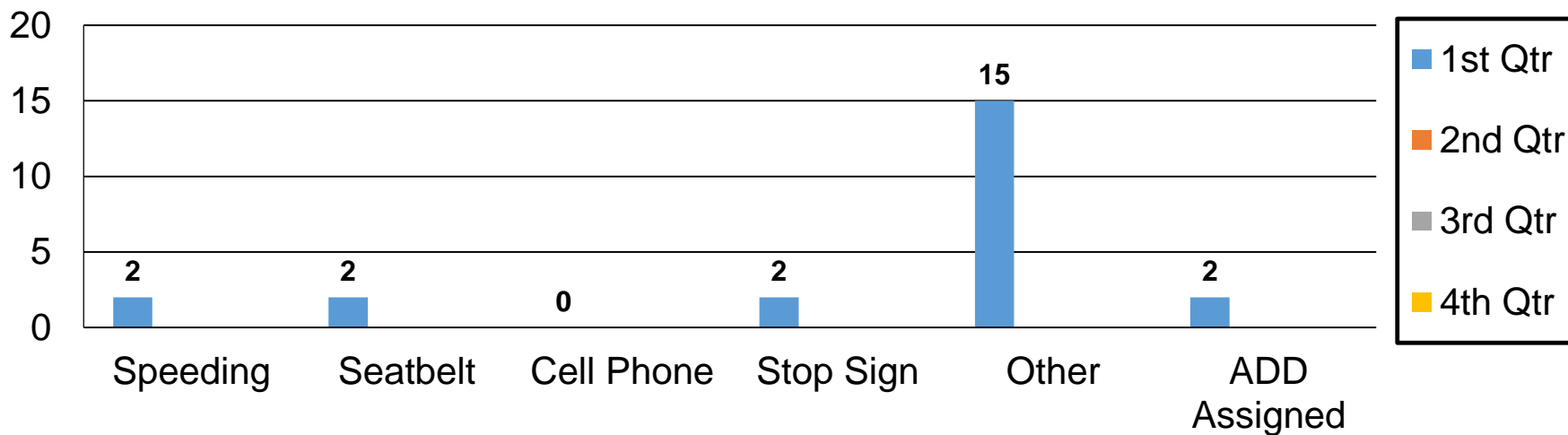

Ergonomics



Workplace Ergonomics Risk Factors

HIGH REPETITION: Many work tasks and cycles are repetitive in nature, and are frequently controlled by hourly or daily production targets and work processes.

- High task repetition, when combined with other risk factors such as high force and/or awkward postures, can contribute to the formation of Musculoskeletal Disorders (MSDs). A job is considered highly repetitive if the cycle time is 30 seconds or less, but it varies drastically among different industries.
- Methods of risk control and reduction include:
automation (telemetry, AI); technique training (mechanic);
within-cycle rotation (stocking)



AWKWARD POSTURES: Place excessive force on joints and overload the muscles and tendons around the affected joint. Joints of the body are most efficient when they operate closest to the mid-range motion of the joint.

- Methods of risk control and reduction include:
equipment (Mechanic's Creepers);
tool extensions (Telescopic Mirrors);
task-individual match (Biomechanics)

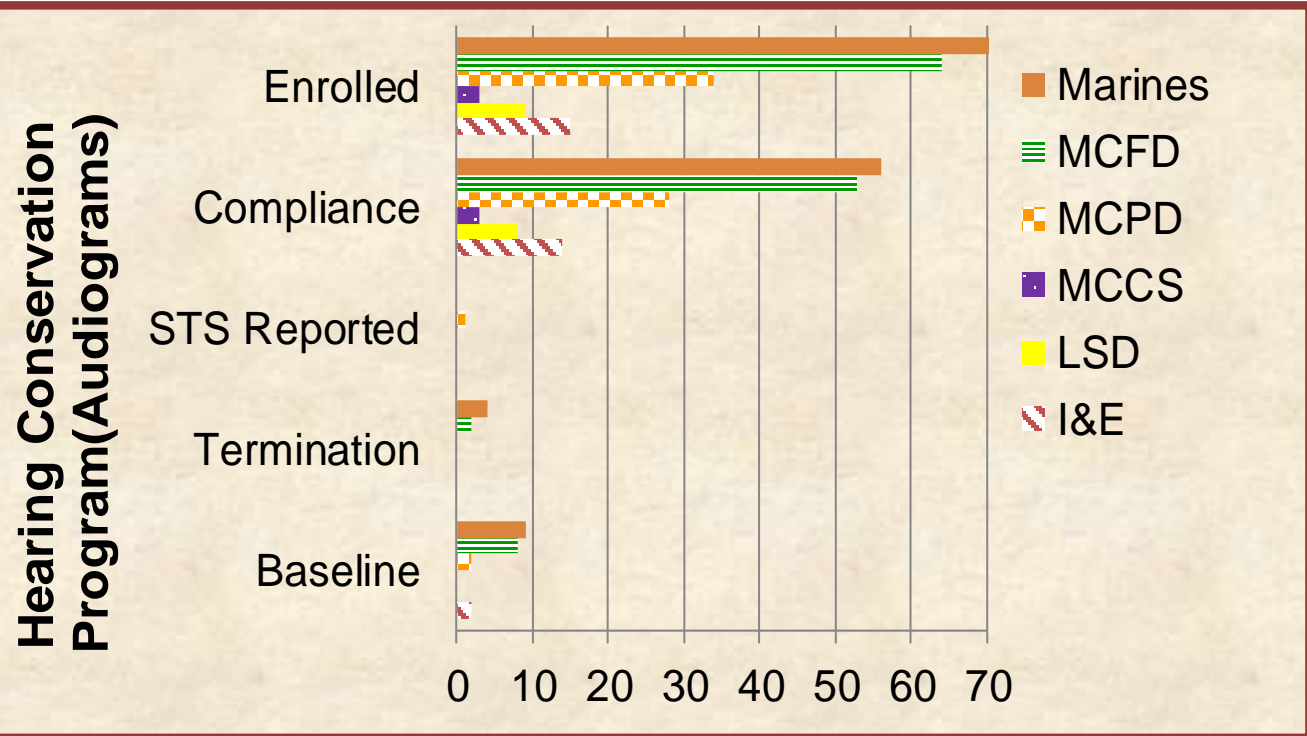

JOINT RISK ASSESSMENT TOOL



The Joint Risk Assessment Tool (JRAT) is an easy to use, menu-driven, multi-service deliberate risk assessment worksheet that can be shared between multiple agencies and personnel.

What can JRAT do for me?

- Provides the user with preloaded mission types, hazards, and service specific mishap statistics to aid in the risk assessment process.
- Allows the user to create their own mission types, subtasks, potential hazards and controls.
- Creates the opportunity to receive input and feedback, collaborate with other agencies, and share lesson learned from previous missions and off-duty activities.
- Allows for easy tracking and accountability throughout the risk assessment process.

Mission types may include:

- Explosive storage and handling
- Environmental Protection Considerations
- Moving Offices
- Severe/Extreme Weather Operations
- Rearranging storage and administrative areas
- Off-duty recreational activities

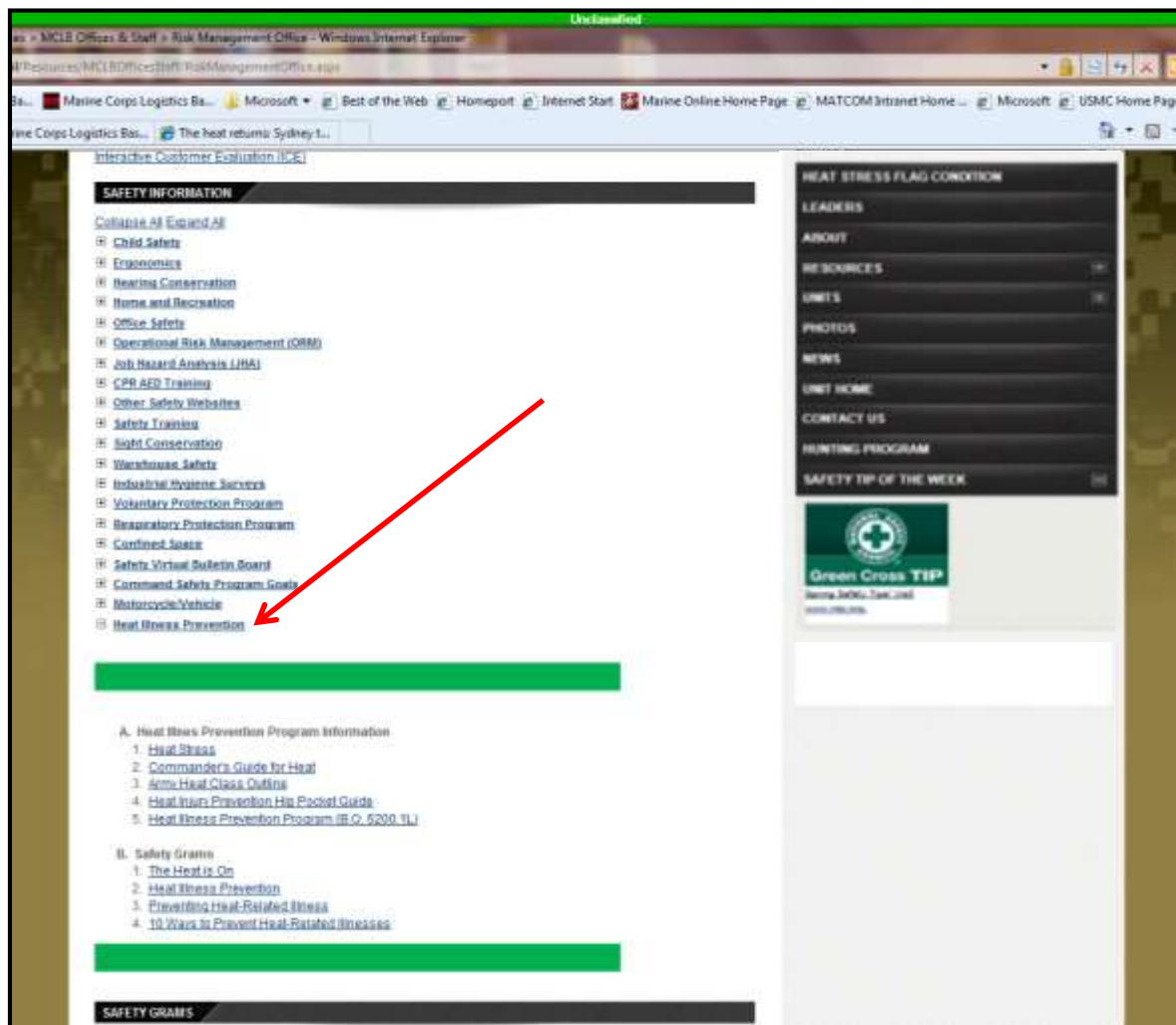

Flag Warning System:

Risk Scale



Green Flag (WBGTI of 80 to 84.9 degrees F): Heavy exercises, for non acclimated personnel, will be conducted with caution and under constant supervision.



Yellow Flag (WBGTI of 85 to 87.9 degrees F): Strenuous exercises or physical labor will be curtailed for non acclimated, newly assigned Marines and Civilian Marines in their first 3 weeks. Avoid outdoor classes or work in the sun.



Red Flag (WBGTI of 88 to 89.9 degrees F): All PT or very strenuous work will be curtailed for those not thoroughly acclimated by at least 3 weeks. Personnel not thoroughly acclimated may carry on limited activity not to exceed 6 hours per day.



Black Flag (WBGTI of 90 and above degrees F): All nonessential physical activity will be halted.

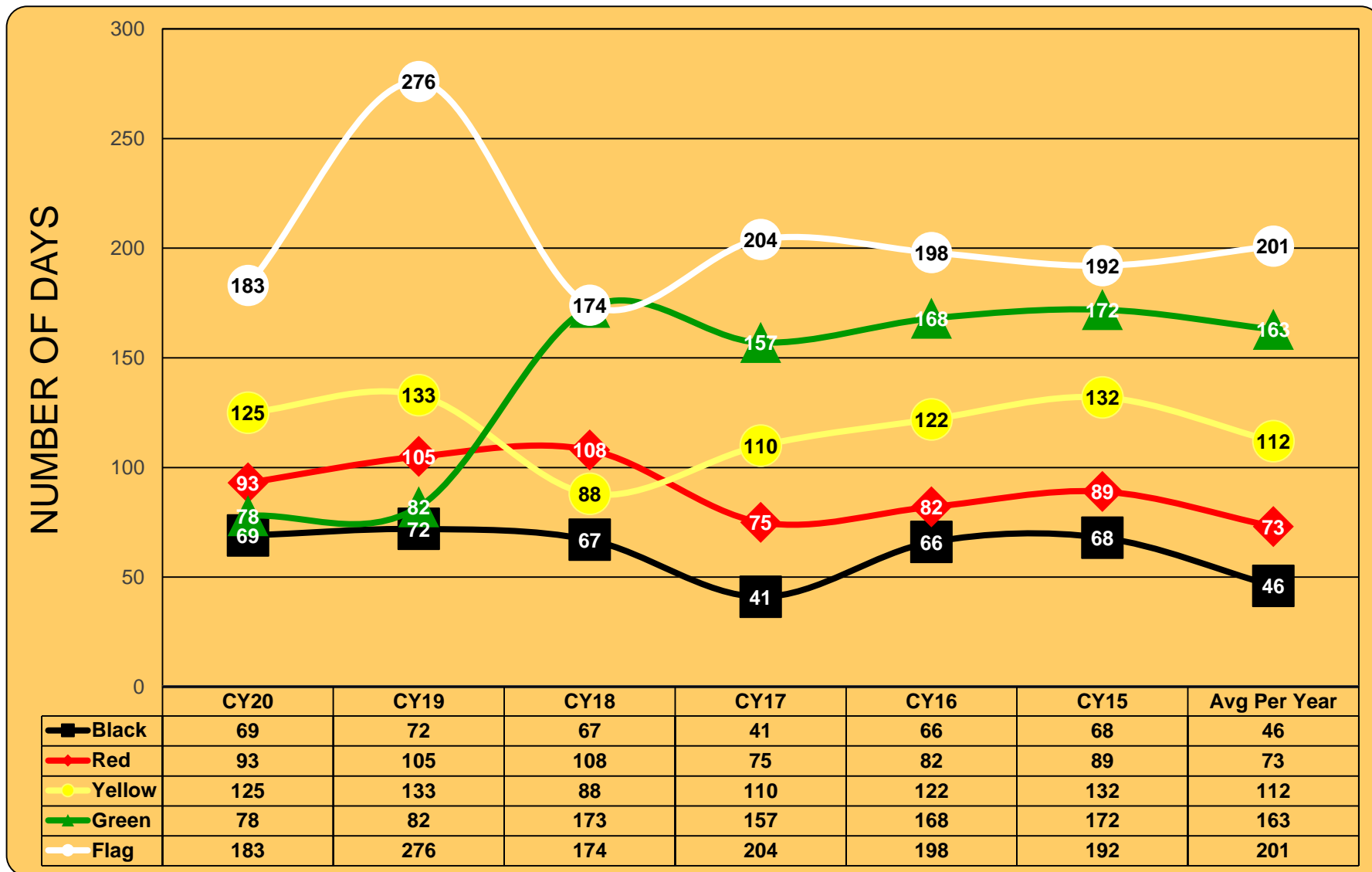





Heat Illness Prevention Program



To help prevent heat related illness:

- Stay hydrated properly with water and diluted electrolyte. Drink water every 15 minutes, even if you are not thirsty.
- Make sure you are acclimated to your environment.
- Rest in the shade to cool down.
- Wear a hat and light-colored clothing if you are working outside.
- If you have a pre-existing health problem, ask your doctors advice before jumping into outdoor activities.
- Learn the signs of heat illness and what to do in an emergency.
- Keep an eye on fellow workers.
