1. Enclosure (1) is the CY 2025 Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses for the Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany (MCLBA) Installation Command. Please comply with the requirements in reference (a) by posting the annual summary on your official bulletin boards from 1 February 2026 to 30 April 2026.

2. This summary outlines the number of Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) recordable injuries and illnesses experienced by MCLBA Installation Command civilian Marines during CY 2025, along with the associated rates. The purpose of posting this summary is to inform employees of workplace mishaps and encourage them to identify, report, and address occupational hazards.

3. The Command experienced four OSHA-recordable injuries in CY 2025. None of the cases resulted in days away from work, job transfers, or restrictions. No injuries were reported from telework locations, and there were no work-related illnesses or diseases.

4. Our Command's commitment to safety excellence has driven a 33% reduction in our OSHA Total Case Incident Rate (TCIR) since 2015. Notably, CY 2025 marked our first-ever year with zero Days Away, Restricted, or Transferred (DART) cases at MCLB Albany. Our TCIR and DART rates are now 71% and 100% below the national average, respectively. These significant reductions are a direct result of our participation in VPP and our commitment to continuous improvement.


