Subj: OFF LIMIT ESTABLISHMENTS DESIGNATED BY THE COMMANDING
OFFICER MARINE CORPS LOGISTICS BASE ALBANY

Ref: (a) MCO 1620.2D
(b) BO 1620.1

1. Purpose. To identify those establishments which have been declared off limits to Armed Forces personnel by the Commanding Officer (CO), Marine Corps Logistics Base (MCLB) Albany.

2. Background. Reference (a) provides that off limits action is a function of the command and may be used by commanders to help maintain good order and discipline and an appropriate level of health, morale, safety, and welfare of Armed Forces personnel. Additionally, it requires that off limit restrictions be made to all Armed Forces personnel who may frequent the areas in question. Reference (b) describes the functioning of the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board (AFDCB) and how the board advises the CO MCLB Albany. This bulletin provides a current list of off limits establishments identified by the Commanding Officer MCLB Albany.

3. Action

a. Tenant Commands will inform service members in their commands that they are prohibited from conducting business with:

Sand Trap Lounge (a.k.a) Club Sand Trap 5.0 1412 Radium Springs Road, Albany, GA

Big Daddy's Lounge, 300 E. Broad Ave, Albany, GA

An off limit establishment is defined as any business, building, place, structure, vehicle, conveyance, or area which military personnel are prohibited to patronize, enter, visit, use or ride. In accordance with BO 1620.1, the installation commander

distribution is limited.

has the authority to place an establishment off-limits if it is determined to be harmful to the welfare and safety of Marines, sailors, and their dependents. Visiting these places violates BO 1620.1, which is a punitive order and violators may be punished under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). As a matter of policy, a change in ownership, management or name of the off limit establishment does not, in and of itself, revoke the off limit restriction. Accordingly, the Commanding Officer MCLB Albany, based on recommendations from the AFDCB, has declared the following areas/establishments as off limits areas establishments to all Armed Forces personnel. Since off limit areas/establishment may have the potential to change names and identifying features; these addresses, locations, and general descriptions will make them clearly identifiable despite superficial changes that may done by them. The below listed off limit areas/establishments will remain off limits until deleted from this list by subsequent changes to the bulletin. Entering the premises of the off limit areas/establishment listed in this bulletin are punitive under the UCMJ.

b. The contents of this bulletin will be widely disseminated to all Armed Forces personnel stationed, temporarily assigned, or visiting MCLB Albany. This bulletin will be posted on all command/organizational read boards, the base webpage, and newspaper.

c. In accordance with reference (b), the President of the AFDCB is responsible for publishing an accurate and current listing of those areas/establishments declared off limits quarterly.

4. Reserve Applicability. The provisions of this bulletin are applicable to all military personnel assigned to MCLB Albany and all tenant commands residing therein.
