HALLOWEEN Safety Tips



-  All costumes, wigs and accessories should be fire-resistant.
-  Avoid masks, which can obstruct vision.
-  Fasten reflective tape to their costumes and bags, or give them glow sticks.



Tips for Motorists

-  Slow down when driving through neighborhoods while children are trick-or-treating.
-  Watch for children walking on roadways, medians and curbs.
-  Enter and exit driveways and alleys carefully.
-  At twilight and later in the evening, watch for children in dark clothing.

-  A responsible adult should accompany young children on the neighborhood rounds.
-  If your older children are going alone, plan and review a route acceptable to you.
-  Agree on a specific time children should return home.
-  Teach your children never to enter a stranger's home or car.
-  Instruct children to travel only in familiar, well-lit areas and stick with their friends.
-  Tell your children not to eat any treats until they return home.
-  Children and adults are reminded to put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, do not run across the street.
